

Preparing Your Property for Exterior Painting

A little preparation goes a long way toward ensuring an efficient and polished exterior painting project. Please take a moment to review the steps below before our team arrives:

1. Clear the Perimeter

Move outdoor furniture, grills, potted plants, and décor items at least several feet away from the surfaces being painted. This allows us safe, open access to your home's exterior.

2. Trim Landscaping

Please cut back trees, bushes, or vines that touch or obstruct the walls, windows, or trim. Proper clearance helps us achieve clean, even coverage and protects your plants from paint exposure.

3. Close Windows & Doors

Ensure all doors and windows are tightly shut before painting begins. This helps prevent dust and paint mist from entering your home.

4. Remove Wall Fixtures

Take down house numbers, light fixtures, or decorative accents you'd like painted behind. If items will remain, we'll carefully work around them unless otherwise discussed.

5. Vehicle Safety

If possible, park cars away from the immediate work zone or in the garage to avoid accidental overspray or dust.

6. Power Outlets & Outdoor Décor

Unplug or remove any outdoor string lights, extension cords, or accessories near the painting area.

7. Pet & Family Coordination

Keep pets and children indoors or away from active work areas for their safety and ours during the project.

8. Weather Considerations

Exterior work is weather-dependent. If conditions change, our team will communicate promptly to adjust scheduling as needed.
