

Preparing Your Space for Cabinet Painting

1. Clear Cabinet Contents

Please remove all dishes, food items, and personal belongings from inside the cabinets and drawers. Empty surfaces allow our team to work efficiently and keep your items free from dust or paint residue.

2. Remove Countertop Items

Take small appliances, décor, or utensils off your counters to provide full access to your cabinetry and to protect them from any overspray or debris.

3. Disconnect Electronics

If applicable, unplug countertop devices, under-cabinet lighting, or electronics near the work area to prevent accidental paint contact.

4. Ensure Adequate Ventilation

While we use low-odor, high-quality products, maintaining airflow is important. Please keep windows or vents open where possible to help with air circulation during and after painting.

5. Plan for Limited Access

Cabinet projects often take multiple days to allow for prep, priming, painting, and curing. You may wish to plan meals or routines around limited kitchen or bathroom access during this period.

6. Pet & Family Safety

Keep pets and children away from the workspace to avoid disruptions and ensure safety throughout the project.

7. Discuss Hardware Preferences

If you'd like handles, knobs, or hinges removed or replaced, please have them detached before the project begins or let us know in advance so we can plan accordingly.
